Teachers and staff members will focus specifically on the behaviors exhibited by a student that causes our culture to stand out above the rest. The following are Palmer's House descriptions and the focus of the contributory behavior:

Integrity - Integritas ~ Soundness of moral character

- A. Student has the ability to make the right choices when no one is watching.
- B. Student has the ability to be trusted in words and deeds.
- C. A description that is earned and should be prized.

Courage - Virtus ~ Strength in the face of adversity

- A. Student has the ability to face difficulty without fear.
- B. Student has the ability to practice compassion with self and others.
- C. A description that embraces the whole heart and one's imperfections.
- Aspire *Spirare* ~ Ambition to achieve a goal
 - A. Student has the ability to direct one's hopes and ambitions to attaining a higher goal.
 - B. Student has the ability to yearn for something more.
 - C. A description that encompasses one's desires and hopes for the future.
- Noble *Optimus* ~ Reveal talents through generosity & forgiveness
 - A. Student has the ability to be trustworthy and honest.
 - B. Student has the ability to help others when gaining nothing in return.
 - C. A description that distinguishes one's excellence through personal talents.

Teachers and staff who observe any encompassing contributory behavior from a student will give the student a handwritten card explaining the behavior that was exuded by the student and give them a Leader of the Pack t-shirt. We would like to show off to our community that our students are great kids, and we will have a dedicated page on Palmer Public School's website that has pictures of students receiving their shirts and a brief explanation of the contributory behavior, so please check this page out in your spare time!
